THIS WEEK'S LESSON: FOR GOOD



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Bruce Wayne turned the greatest tragedy of his life into something good when he chose to become Batman. Bad things are going to happen, but it's up to us to give those things to God so that something good can come from them. Genesis 45, Joseph Saves His Family



M HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

When something disappointing happens this week, stop a moment with your kids. Why is this a disappointment? Can you think of any good that might come of it? Pray about it as a family, and let God turn something bad into something good.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Why did Joseph forgive his brothers?
- How did God use Joseph's bad fortune for good?
- Why do we need to give bad times and disappointments to God?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"Whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God." 1 Corinthians 10:31b (NIV)



PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

God uses our bad times, our disappointments, and our heartbreaks to build our faith and draw us closer to God. If your family or someone you know is going through rough times, ask God to step in and make all things work out for His glory.
