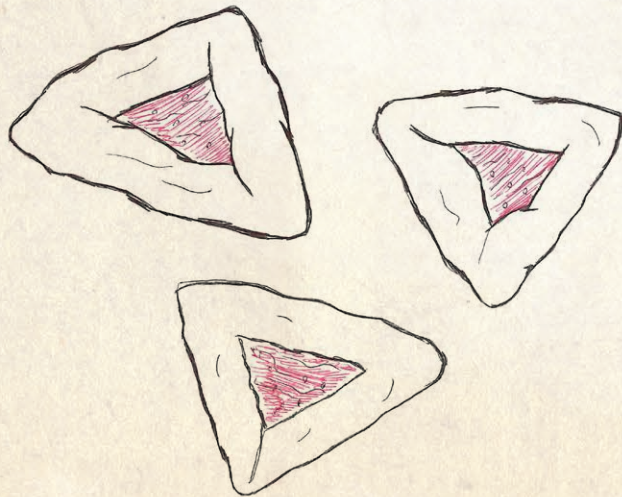
Hamantaschen Recipe

During the festival of Purim, Jews make and eat fruit-filled cookies shaped like Haman's hat. Families read the story of Esther to their children, who eat the cookies when God defeats His enemy Haman!

Make sure to post an allergy alert before serving these cookies to toddlers!

Ingredients (yields 60 cookies)

- 1 c. softened butter or margarine
- 2 c. sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 3 eggs
- 4 c. flour
- jam, fruit pie filling, or chocolate chips



Directions

1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit.
2. Beat butter, sugar, eggs, and vanilla together. Add flour.
3. Form the dough into 3-inch longs, wrap in plastic wrap and freeze until slightly firm
4. Remove from freezer. Slice into ¼-inch slices.
5. Spoon filling of your choice in the center of each slice. Fold each circle into a triangle shape, pinching the edges closed. (Note: the dough folds best when it is thawed, but it is easiest to cut when a little frozen.)
6. Place the triangles on a cookie sheet lined with parchment paper. Bake at 350 degrees Fahrenheit for about 20 minutes, or until the cookies are golden brown.
