

• Play dress-up with your kids and re-enact the story. Discuss with them the ways God showed that He was in control even when Haman made an evil plan to hurt God's people.



• Build a pillow fort with your family. Talk about the importance of walls in Bible times. Discuss how Jesus protects us from enemies.








Keyword Crossing


- The people asked Ezra to read them God's law.
